A RESOLUTION PLEDGING SUPPORT FOR CONTINUED ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT WITHIN THE CITY OF CUBA, MISSOURI, AND ADOPTING GUIDELINES FOR PROVIDING INCENTIVES TO BUSINESS AND INDUSTRIES WITHIN THE CITY THAT CONTINUE TO GROW AND EXPAND.

Recitals:

- A. The City of Cuba, Missouri, ("City") desires to continue to promote commercial and industrial development in and about the City.
- B. The Board of Aldermen of the City has determined that it is in the best interests of the City to pledge support and commit financial assistance to existing businesses and industries that continue to grow and expand within the City.
- C. The Board of Aldermen believes the best way to promote commercial and industrial growth within the City is to provide a framework of economic commitments and incentives which the City is willing to offer to business and industry in exchange for continued expansion and growth within the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1 - The City hereby pledges its continuing support and commitment to encourage the growth of existing business and industry in the City.

Section 2 - Commencing with the effective date hereof, the City shall offer the economic incentives set forth on the attached Exhibit "A" to any existing business or industry located within the city that meets the required standards for growth or expansion.

Section 3 - The City shall from time-to-time review and modify the economic incentives set forth herein to ensure that they are necessary and effective to maintain businesses and industries to the City.

Section 4 - The City shall work with the Cuba Development Group, Inc., a non-profit corporation, in processing and reviewing applications made under the incentive program.

Section 5 - The City may from time-to-time and on a case-by-case basis negotiate with businesses and industries willing to commit to expand within the City such further incentives as the City deems necessary and advisable.

Section 6 - The City reserves the right to cap the number of participants in the program. The current cap is set at a maximum of seven businesses.

Section 7 - The City will reserve the right to postpone any new incentives due to financial stress of the City at the sole discretion of the Board of Aldermen.

Section 8 - This resolution shall be in full force and effect as of the date of its passage by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Cuba, Missouri.

Exhibit "A"

1. City of Cuba Utility User Charge Abatement

- City of Cuba Electric, Water, and Sewer Utility User Charge Abatements:
 - Beginning 1 Year after date of Notice of Intent (NOI)
 - Abatements over 3 Year Period
 - Year 1: 14%
 - Year 2: 14%
 - Year 3: 14%

If they are returning business, the new abatement will be on the new meter for expansion only. If it is not possible for a new meter to be installed, abatement shall be on any amount in excess of the average preceding 12-month period.

- City of Cuba offers competitive pricing of Natural Gas with streamlined access to utility.
- Qualifying companies required:
 - To locate within the City of Cuba.
 - Create a minimum of 10 new jobs,
 - Capital Investment a minimum of \$250,000.
 - Expansion Investment \$250,000 minimum,
 - Expansion job creation minimum of 10 new jobs.
 - Be current and always remain current on all payments owed to the City of Cuba.
 - If a company is late on payments, the city at its sole discretion may remove that business from the program, and that program may not re-apply for a period of six months.
- A. Meet all Timeline Requirements
 - a. Jobs created within 12 months of Notice of Intent.
 - b. Jobs maintained throughout duration of incentive program.
 - c. Capital Improvements created within 12-24 months of Notice of Intent.
 - d. Capital Investment made within 12-24 months of Notice of Intent.
- B. Meet all Reporting Requirements
 - a. File all mandatory quarterly reports with City of Cuba / CDG.
 - b. If requested, allow quarterly on-site reviews of facility by City of Cuba / CDG.
 - c. Respond to all requests, on time, by City of Cuba / CDG.
 - d. Allow employee records to be verified by Council's designated person, and copies of records to be kept at City Hall.
- C. Process
 - a. Reviewed by Cuba Development Group, Inc. (CDG) and City of Cuba.
 - b. 30 Day Review Period
 - c. Review Committee
 - i. CDG President
 - ii. Mayor, City of Cuba
 - iii. City Clerk
 - iv. Director of Public Works
 - v. Alderman
 - vi. City Attorney

- e. Incentive Letter Awarded by City of Cuba – Board of Aldermen.

2. City of Cuba Real Property Tax Exemption

- City of Cuba does not collect Real Property Tax.
- All businesses located in the City of Cuba qualify.

3. City of Cuba Personal Property Tax Exemption

- City of Cuba does not collect Personal Property Tax.
- All businesses located in the City of Cuba qualify.
